Researching Naval Personnel



This guide sheet provides information on how to research naval personnel including find an individual's service records.

The National Museum of the Royal Navy only holds a very limited number of service related documents as most are held by the Ministry of Defence or the National Archives.

Records for those serving before or during World War 1

Royal Marine Attestation Packs:

Approximately 60,000 of these are held within the date range 1850 to 1923. Others can be found at the National Archives.

The records include:

- RMLI (Plymouth, Chatham & Portsmouth Divisions) Continuous Service (CS) & Short Service (SS)
- RMA CS & SS; RND (Divisional Engineers, Divisional Train, RM Medical Unit, Ordnance Company) Deal Short Service
- RMB Royal Naval School of Music
- RM Labour Corps (New Formation) Short Service

WRNS Attestment Papers:

For WRNS Officers, First World War 1917-1919.

Royal Naval Reserve Ratings:

Original service cards (approx. A3 size) for 140,000 ratings. These relate to people who earned their living by seafaring but were also members of the RN Reserve, to be called up in case of hostilities.

Royal Naval Division:

Original service cards (approx. A5 size) for 50,000 RND officers and men.

<u>Submarine Movement</u> Cards:

Original service cards (approx. A5 size) for Submarine officer and ratings from 1914-1968. Note some of the later dated cards will be subject to data protection regulations.

Ship Movement Records:

First World War record for 1915-1922.

Second World War records held in 27 volumes. These indicate movements between ports but do not record time at sea. The ships include small vessels taken up from trade and some coastal forces.

Casualty Logs & Warship Logs:

Casualty logs, 10 volumes from 1939-45, and 1 volume of warship logs, 1939-1945.
